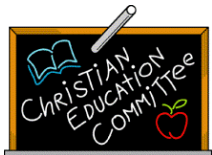
Enjoy your summer. Come to church when you can.

### Up Coming Events

- ◆ Our summer program and **40 Minute Club** will begin on **June 23<sup>rd</sup>**. Like last year, we will have two groups that leave the sanctuary following the junior sermon: the first group will be for grades PreK-3 and the second group will be for grades 4-7. (Teens who have completed 8<sup>th</sup> grade or higher are expected to stay for worship.
- ◆ Parents of kids in grades K-7 are asked to take a turn or two running the 40 Minute Club program this summer. A lesson plan and craft are provided. Parents and other adult volunteers can sign up to be a teacher or an aide. Pairs of friends work well together. Parents who sign up as teachers can pick the craft for their week.
- ◆ We will play some **Memorial Day Games** at Pastor Cobb's **Memorial Day Picnic** which will take place at the manse on Sunday, May 26<sup>th</sup> at noon. Among other activities there will be some old-fashioned fun which will include a hoola hoop contest, watermelon seed spitting contest, water balloon toss, closest to the pin frog toss, and fullest pitcher water challenge. Were you looking for some ways to cool off and have fun? Hopefully you'll join us for the picnic.
- ◆ **June 8<sup>th</sup> is our canoe trip.** We'll be canoeing from the Wading Pines Campground located in the Chatsworth area of NJ about 30 minutes north up the parkway. The cost for a canoe is \$40 which will normally hold 2 people. A third person may be added to a canoe for the additional charge of \$5. Bring a picnic lunch, towel, sunscreen, and bug spray. We'll leave the church at 10 am and get to the site around 10:30. Hopefully we'll be in the water canoeing by 11am. We'll stop for a picnic lunch along the way and be done around 2 pm. Every one should be back home by 3 pm. The church van will drive up and back. Usually we have a bit of a caravan going.
- ◆ **June 9<sup>th</sup> is Teacher Recognition Sunday.** We certainly appreciate the commitment our teachers, aides, substitutes, and sponsors have provided for our kids. ## Uganda Auction at Ocean Heights Church June 8

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### Stewardship Committee Report

The statistical summary for April shows that our church finances continue in the black with giving and investment income on par with last year at this time. The difference when comparing year to year is that rental income was a plus \$6663.95 this year compared to a loss of \$1,430.49 last year. So, rather than being under budget by \$9,843.07 as we were last year at this time, we are over budget by \$834.88! Two negative items of note, however, are that our average weekly giving for the past two months has been less than the same months last year and there was one more week in the same period last year. This latter factor will catch up with us eventually.

Let us hope that our good fortune continues for the rest of the year.

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## **The Bad News and the Good News**

“Behold, I am making all things new.” ~ Revelation 21:5

One of the presenters in Nashville where I spent my study leave May 13-17 was David Lose, a homiletics professor and church growth expert from a Lutheran seminary in Minneapolis whose books fascinate me. (I just used one to teach different views of atonement to my Monday Bible study.) David’s lecture was about future church trends, and he spoke about contemporary music, interactive preaching, changing liturgy, and the effect of social media, advertising and cultural shifts in America. It was overwhelming, since his lecture included movie clips, advertising clips, the significance of logos, economic uncertainty, and the loss of faith in our institutions.

All 2,000 of us sat anxiously awaiting for him to tell us how to navigate the church through tough times. Surely he knew. He said, “I have bad news and good news.”

“The bad news is there is no playbook. There are no new rules that work for everybody. Sorry.” he said. We were disappointed.

“Now for the good news. There is no playbook. You will have to vision with your officers to find what works better for you in worship, program, mission, education, and fellowship. It’s different for everybody depending on the make up of your congregation. The reason this is good news is that when people say ‘You’re not following the playbook. We’ve always done it this way.’ you can say ‘There is no longer a playbook. What we used to do has little relevance in this environment except to say the definition of insanity is to do the same thing over and over expecting different results.’ It’s good news because now you can do many things, try many things, and reinvent worship, programs and mission, Christian education, etc. So try it. Find what works for you. Don’t let old thinking keep you from the new things God is calling you to do.”

Friends, that’s not just where denominations are, it’s where we are. We need to reinvent ourselves. We need to give ourselves permission to try new things and to fail once in a while. And the process will take years.

That’s not bad news. God is always working to display His Spirit in new ways. This is the season of Pentecost. Let the wind blow and the fire burn.

I can’t wait.
