Every morning for the last few weeks, in the early hours, I have gone out on our back

porch to read. I have watched the wrens that moved into our birdhouse work diligently to prepare for their new arrivals. I was waiting and waiting to hear the sound of baby birds chirping away. THEN, one night I was out putting some trash in our can and I thought I heard a faint chirping sound . . . I stopped what I was doing, was very still, and then YES - there it was again, an ever so faint chirp they had arrived. I had a fleeting moment of craziness where I wanted to go out to the dollar store and get pink and blue balloons to tie to the birdhouse! The morning, next everything was quiet. I opened the porch door (which makes a

bit of a loud sound) and sat down to read. When everything was quiet again CHIRP, CHIRP, CHIRP . . . those little birds lungs sure had strengthened overnight! The interesting thing to me is, every time I made a noise - they were quiet. I truly could and still can only hear their chirping and the mother and father wrens singing when all is quiet - it is like turning a switch off and on something makes a noise - they immediately shut up . . . as soon as it is still again - the glorious chirping and singing begins. (As I sit here writing this the neighbor started to mow his lawn and the birds immediately stopped their chirping!)

It's no wonder the Psalms repetitively shout - "Be still and know that I am God" . . . it is in the

stillness that we know. Things become so much clearer in the stillness - noises become louder, colors become brighter and God is recognized!

These next weeks and even months are gloriously full for me - traveling, teaching, meeting up with those I have taught and discipled in the past - so much great activity. Yet even good activity can

drown out the song - and through my little bird tenants, God seems to be speaking quite loudly.

Be still . . . listen to my song, listen to the song of others and listen to your life song. These songs make the stillness a beautiful symphony!

Stewardship Committee Report

For the rest of this year, the statistical report will be given in two ways - with and without including the expense of a major repair to one of the rental properties. Earlier this year, a major repair involving a new roof and mold remediation was authorized for the Leek house (23 School Street). The cost of this project to the Rental Property account was \$18,000. Beginning with the June General Fund report, this \$18,000 is showing up as a repair expense to this property. When adding the income and deducting expenses, the net result for this property at the end of May is a negative \$14,267.43. The net result of rental income for the three rental properties (19 School Street, 23 School Street and the Stopfer Building) at the end of May is a negative \$7,884.51. Thus, when deducting the \$18,000 from the rental portion of our General Fund status at the end of May, we are in the red by \$13,567.76, whereas we had been in the black each of the previous months of this year.

I am choosing to also report our General Fund Income status for this year without considering the \$18,000 expenditure. If this had not occurred our rental income at the end of May would be a positive \$14,245.91 instead of the negative \$7,884.51 and we would have been over our budgetary needs by \$8,562.13.

As we progress through the year, with all our rental properties rented and there are no more extraordinary repair expenses, I expect to see a monthly decline in our General Fund deficit.

The good news is that when compared to last year at this time, the level of giving is about the same as is our investment income.

As we enter the lazy days of summer, I encourage you to continue attending church, volunteering and participating in the summer activities and keeping up with your pledges so we can continue to pay our bills.

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Pointing People in the Right Direction

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I and remember. Lam with you always to the and of the age." Matthew 28:10, 20

have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." ~ Matthew 28:19-20

Our steeple has developed a lean. The derecho, Superstorm Sandy, and 150 years of bad weather are taking a toll. What corrective measures we can take may be limited, but the lean towards the ocean is only slight, anyway.

It was interesting to me that one of the things we talked about at the Property Committee meeting on July 19 was the fact that our steeple has guided airplanes into the Atlantic City Airport since WWII. We are on the flight path of landings coming in off the ocean so the question was "Will the lean of the steeple affect those small aircraft trying to get their bearings?" I can't imagine that it would since all flights have navigation systems that track them onto the runway with radar, but it's an interesting question. Would our lean point them to the left or right instead of on the straight and narrow path to the perfect landing?

But what is more important is where are we as a church and individuals pointing people. It is said that a steeple needs to point straight up pointing people to God or heaven. The company that manufactures the fiberglass steeple we have on our church now manufactures a giant fiberglass hand with a finger pointing straight up (the INDEX finger, people).

Our society is inundated in cultural myths, creeping secularism and declining values that are pointing our young people in the wrong direction. We know that wealth doesn't necessarily lead to happiness, or good looks to success. We know there is no way to be absolutely safe in a dangerous world, or that society's values are always correct (look at the history of racism, homophobia, etc.). And even if you achieve the American dream of a good job and marriage and a house of your own you will not necessarily find satisfaction, peace of mind, or purpose. We will always need belief in something beyond ourselves to point the way to hope, direction, calling, and eternal security in Jesus. Sadly, the world's direction is always leaning toward materialism, hedonism, narcissism, and fatalism.

Our faith points people in a Godly direction, leading to wholeness, purpose, ultimate satisfaction, mission, and Christian family values. There is no substitute for Christ's presence which moves us in the straight and narrow of His calling.

As a church our goal is to point people in the right direction. Let's believe in what we're doing, and let's do it. If we don't, the world will point them toward something else.

P.S. And don't worry about the steeple. It is very secure and will not fall over.
