### **Joe Griswold To Do Minute For Mission June 29**

Joe Griswold founded the Mustard Seed Academy in Lukaya, Uganda. This school not only teaches but does health care and feeding ministries as well. They currently have

502 students enrolled. Joe will be talking about this ministry which he started and runs during a Minute For Mission on Sunday, June 29.

About a dozen members of our church sponsor a student or a teacher (there are now 55 paid staff), and this is a great opportunity to keep in touch with a child you are caring for. (See Joe or Pastor Gerry about this program.)

We will be participating in the Christmas in September offering which will be received after Labor Day. This is a special gift package for the families of the students and includes food basics, meat, soap and other household items. Each

package costs about \$10 and will feed the family of a student over the holidays. More information will follow.

On June 7 the Brigantine and Ocean Heights churches ran a mission fair at the Ocean Heights church which raised over \$9,700 for the academy. This will go towards laptop computers and electronic equipment for the students. These kids are reaching up out of poverty, and we are helping them.

### **Community Fun Day to Take Place on August 16<sup>th</sup> from 12 to 4 pm**

Russell Adkisson, Kirk Conover, and the Mission/Evangelism Committee are leading the way for a major evangelistic event this summer. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Community Fun Day will take place on the end lot behind the manse on Saturday, August 16<sup>th</sup>, from noon to 4 pm. Like last year we will be opening this event to the public free of charge. It is the highlight of the summer. I bet you think I'm talking about July 4<sup>th</sup> Independence Day. Although, this year, I've been invited to an Independence Day celebration at the residence of the US Ambassador, July 4<sup>th</sup> isn't a day celebrated by most Czechs.

So, what holiday could I mean? Well, I'm talking about the major summer holiday here in the Czech Republic, July 6<sup>th</sup>. So what happened on July 6<sup>th</sup> that merits so much celebration? In a way it's a day that celebrates independence. It is the date that marks the death of an important figure here in the Czech Republic. On July 6, 1415 Jan Hus was burned at the stake in Constance, Germany. He was tried and executed there as a heretic because he called for reform in the Church. Since then he has become a national hero who represents the struggle for freedom and truth. As people of faith, members of the Evangelical Church of Czech Brethren (ECCB) will mark the holiday as they remember this important medieval preacher who died for his faith and laid the foundation for reformation in the Church.

As you gather to mark the independence of our nation remember those, like Jan Hus, who have fought for freedom and reform in our nations and our Church.

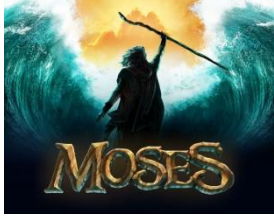
### **Stewardship Committee Report**

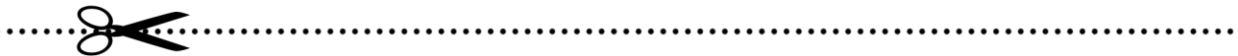
- Bob Gillis and our adult mentors who have been working with our confirmands the last two months. June 22 was a joyous Confirmation Sunday!

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### **Evangelism: Taking Someone On The Journey You Already Have.**

“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember I am with you always, to the end of the age.” ~ Matthew 28:19-20

As you read this Jan and I will be on our second Alaskan cruise. A few things are different, like we will leave from Seattle, but the big stops in Skagway, Juneau, Glacier National Park, etc. are the same. We hope to do some of the same excursions, like the Klondike train ride and glacier walking, again.

One of your most common reactions to this cruise is Why would you take a similar trip? I’ll tell you why – Janna Beth and her friend, Al, want to go. They have never been, so it will be exciting to walk them through it. Their awe and amazement will make this trip just as special as the first one. Al has never flown, so we need to walk through that part of the journey as well.

Being needed, sharing first time joys, and knowing we are adding a new life journey with the people we care about will make this trip just as special as the first time trip, maybe better. The more the merrier, and the memories shared will go with us all.

It occurs to me that this is what evangelism should be all about – taking someone on a faith journey that has been special to us. Even if that journey has faded over time, taking someone new will refresh us for the journey in new ways. Indeed, helping someone in their faith journey always adds to our own. And when our faith is tested like in times of death, sickness, or loss, the special growth lessons we help others with help us to know how to handle our own faith in times of special need.

All we need to do is reach out and take the journey with them. Their new faith blessings help us recall and relive our own.

When we call faith a “private matter” and keep it to ourselves (Why do Presbyterians think that way?) we reveal an inner insecurity and marginalize our own walk with the Lord.

But when we joyfully take someone on that journey, they are enriched and we are spiritually energized as we relive the spiritual vitality of our own early conversion.

Now that’s a “win-win-win-win” - a win for a new believer, a win for your own spirituality, a win for church growth, and a win for God. It doesn’t get any better than that.

So, just do it. Look for someone to take on your spiritual journey. They will thank you.
