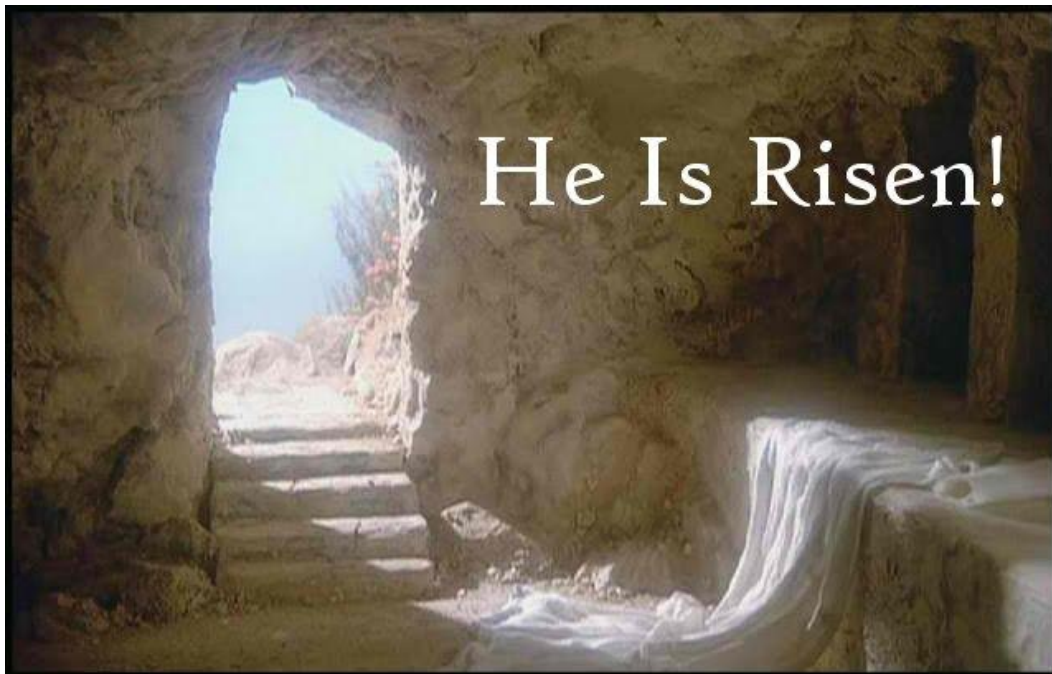

## Holy Week Services

Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, March 29, and service will open with a Processional of the Palms led by our Sunday School children. We will give out palms and the bell choir is preparing special music.

Holy Thursday is April 2, and we will observe this holy night of the first communion at the Methodist church. We leave silently from this service as the first disciples did with Jesus.

Good Friday we begin at 8:30 a.m. in the vestibule of our church. We will enter quietly and stand at the altar. The short service sponsored by the Doug Jablonski Men's Fellowship will feature music and readings with Good Friday Thoughts by Vic Werner. After the service we will move to Madden Hall for breakfast prepared by the Men's Fellowship. There is no charge, but there will be baskets on the table for donations. Many last year found this to be the most moving part of their Lenten experience.

At noon on Good Friday there is an ecumenical service at St. Mark and All Saints church sponsored by the Absecon/Galloway clergy. Come and keep this vigil at the cross.

On Easter Sunday, April 5, we will meet at Heritage Park at 7:00 a.m. to welcome our Lord's resurrection. Bill Zeltman will play trumpet. Join us for a time of joy in nature's surroundings.

The worship schedule at our church is normal on Easter – 9:30 and 11:00. Rev. Scott Morschauer will be preaching. Bring flowers with you to put on the cross in the front yard.

## What To Do When The Fire Alarm Goes Off

On occasion our fire alarm system will go off, sometimes it is from an activity or work being done that will trigger a sensor; sometimes it is an emergency. In either case there is one rule and only one:

### **GET OUT OF THE BUILDING IMMEDIATELY**

There are also some "Do Nots":

DO NOT panic. Yes, the alarm is ear-splitting...and scary. Get your coats and personal items, look for those who may need assistance, and leave by the closest exit. It's much quieter outside and you're not in the way of responders.

DO NOT call the fire department and cancel an alarm. They are required to respond even if it is an accidental trigger.

DO NOT touch the keypad. A location code is displayed on the screen which helps first responders. If the code is cleared, responders don't know where to go first (sanctuary, hall, education wing, or daycare).

We can take a cue from Alphabet Alley and Mrs. Barnes' Play House and consider those "accidentals" as practice fire drills!

## Mission/Evangelism News

Session unanimously approved our motion to become a host church for the **Family Promise program of Atlantic County**. Things won't start happening for a while because a few things must happen first. A 13<sup>th</sup> church must sign on like we did. A site for the Day Center must be secured along with several 15 passenger vans to transport families back and forth from the host churches to the Day Center. We'll have our work cut out for us, but we believe we have the people and resources necessary to support this program.

**Families** that qualify for this program are screened carefully. We will host up to 14 people at a time four times a year. This could be a combination of 3 or 4 families each with at least one child. The families will stay with us for a week. They will leave our church daily by 7 am and head to the Day Center. From there, daycare is provided for little ones and school age children are bussed to their schools. Adults receive assistance to restore housing and financial stability. Families will return to us at 5:30 pm to prepare dinner and participate in evening activities such as homework, games, crafts, and movies. In addition to our own people, we thought some high school students from Holy Spirit or Absegami might like to help out with the kids. The families settle down for the night between 9:00-10:00 pm. There will always be a minimum of two members from our own congregation with the families including two who will spend the night.

**Fund raising** for the program needs everyone's support. An **art auction** will take place on Saturday, June 6<sup>th</sup> at 8 pm at the St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Galloway Township. Artwork may be previewed from 7:00-8:00 pm before the auction begins. Tickets cost \$10.00. See Priscilla Schultheis or Leo Ransone for tickets and more information. Thank you for your support.

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the **Health kits**, especially the Sunday school who made quite a few kits on Palm Sunday. We will be sending the kits to Church World Service who will send them to areas that have been struck by disasters.

Our **One Great Hour of Sharing** will culminate on Easter Sunday. Thank you to all who contributed to this incredible effort. We truly are fishers of men!

We initiated discussion on this year's **Family Fun Day** which is scheduled for August 15 from 12:00-4:00 pm. The rain date is August 22<sup>nd</sup>. This will be our 3<sup>rd</sup> event and new ideas are already evident. It feels good having some experience with this under our belt. You'll be hearing more about this event soon.

We also talked about the possibility of being part of Camp Johnsonburg's "**Camp on the Road**" in which Camp Johnsonburg would come to us and run the camp for a week. This would include our sister churches: Brigantine Community Church, Victory Deliverance, Jethro, and Ocean Heights. Kids from all 5 churches could attend this camp, and volunteers from each church would help run it. What a great way to have fun, make new friends, and share our faith with each other in culturally diverse arena! We see tremendous opportunities with this concept and look forward to working with Christian Ed in the future. It appears that the summer of 2016 would be the best target for a venture as big as this. That would allow adults from all five churches to plan and prepare for this most unique opportunity.

More on **retreats** and **mission trips** later.

Our **next meeting** will take place on Saturday, April 18th at 9:30 am in the Cobb Lounge.

## The World Is Bigger Than The Czech Republic Day for Cuba 2015

About 40 people gathered for an ecumenical worship service in Martin in the Wall church in Prague on Wednesday 18 March. They gathered as a part of day long activities called "Den pro Kubu-Day for Cuba." This now annual event marks the sense of solidarity the Czechs feel for their brothers and sisters in Cuba. The service was led by Moderator Joel Ruml of the Evangelical Church of Czech Brethren. The preacher for the service was well known Roman Catholic professor Tomáš Halík. He has written a number of books about faith

in many languages including Czech and English. Other participants included the Old Catholic Bishop Dušan Hejbal and representatives from other churches. Music included several pieces from Taize which were sung by the congregation. Milan Jakobec, a former diplomat to Cuba, sang two original songs he composed in Spanish. The congregation was also joined by a woman from Cuba. The gathering particularly noted the sacrifices of the “Women in White-Las Damas de Bianco.” These women are the wives and relatives of jailed dissidents who began their peaceful marches in 2003. Although they are regarded with suspicion by the Cuban government they continue to attend Mass weekly followed by peaceful marches afterwards. They wear white as a symbol of peace.

Many Czechs resonate with the struggles of those living in this Communist country. They too pray for peace and hope justice will prevail. They know of the struggles to remain faithful in the midst of persecution and misunderstanding. The Czech Christians hope their “Day for Cuba” can be a sign of their love and solidarity.

Now that the US has opened relations with Cuba I was very moved by my participation in this worship service. Particularly as we move through Lent to Easter, we can all be moved by this witness to love and peace. We all share the hope and prayer that a peaceful and just life will prevail for our brothers and sisters in Cuba. The Czech Christians are a wonderful example of how this might happen.

May the ultimate joy and peace of Easter be with you all,

### **A Note From Lisa**

I wanted to share a poem I have written about Barabbas, the prisoner who the Jews released so that Jesus would be crucified. As I read the stories in scripture, I often wonder what the full story would be. What would it be like to talk with Barabbas AFTER Jesus was crucified, after Jesus resurrected, after Jesus ascended? It would be fascinating to me to know how Barabbas’ life ended. What did he do with the extended freedom he was given? Did his life turn around? Did he start hanging out with Peter or John or any of the other disciples? Did Barabbas embrace the new path that Jesus made available to him? Do we embrace those moments of grace and forgiveness that Jesus extends to us? Have a blessed Easter as you embrace and celebrate all that Jesus sacrificed for you!

### **Barabbas**

There were three of us in the prison cell discussing our terrible fate  
We each had been caught taking what wasn’t ours to take

The other two were thieves, petty criminals, nothing grand  
I had taken someone’s life, blood was dripping down my hands

Death on the cross, are they serious? How did I lose my touch?

I was part of an insurrection - I'm better than this bunch

The crosses are prepared, or so we have been told  
Three thieves sentenced to die before the Passover unfolds

The one thief seemed repentant now that death was drawing near  
The other guy still cold as ice, no tears, no sorrow, no fear

I'm not sure what I was feeling, ashamed at being caught  
This was not the way to die, yet I know it was all my fault

I guess I'm living up to my name, Barabbas, "son of shame"  
Dying on a wooden cross - I have no one else to blame

The guards begin to gossip aloud, someone else has been accused  
That teacher Jesus has been arrested by none other than the Jews

Oh great, it can't get worse than this - my final moments on earth  
Stuck in a cell with some crazy guy who talks about life and worth

Then just as they bring Him into the cell, they call me out by name  
Barabbas, you are free to go, released of all your shame

What is going on right now, forgiven? released? I'm free?  
Jesus looks me in the eyes, He knows who I'm meant to be

The other two thieves are shouting and yelling, this is unfair, unjust  
What about us, we aren't like him - they continue to make a fuss

I walk out the doors of the prison that day, not really sure what took place  
All I remember is the look in His eyes and the expression on His face

For some ridiculous reason - I go to the priest that day  
I tell him I don't want to live up to my name, is there any other way?

He tells me something I never knew, I was not created for shame  
Barabbas too means "son of Abba" - new life, new meaning, new name

I stood in the distance that hour He died, the man who took my place  
Knowing one day, I will stand in His presence, again face to face

For what He did for me that day, is what He does for you  
He took my place, erased my shame and gave me all things new

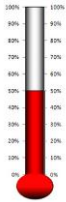

### **An Open Letter to All Churches in West Jersey Presbytery:**

Thank you all for being the Presbytery of West Jersey last night. In word and deed, presentations and conversations, in table fellowship and small groups, in sacrament and song, in sermon and prayer, in care and compassion for one another: The Spirit of the Lord was in us and among us.

While we were voting the 86th vote was cast nationwide in the affirmative for Amendment 14-F to amend the current language of W-4.9000 regarding the definition of marriage. The new wording defining marriage as a "unique commitment between two people, traditionally a man and a woman, to love and support each other for the rest of their lives," will be a part of our Book of Order on June 21, 2015. The full wording of the amendment can be found as an attachment to this letter.

As we saw last evening in our vote of 71 in the affirmative, 51 in the negative and one "no action" that as a presbytery we are passionate about our expression in living in faithfulness to the call to follow Jesus Christ and our understanding of scripture. This is a time to listen to one another as our preacher shared with us and to encourage one another.

Please be reminded that the new wording allows every elder to listen to the Spirit in making decisions about officiating at a marriage ceremony; there is nothing that compels any pastor or session to participate in a wedding between two people of the same gender:

"Nothing herein shall compel a teaching elder to perform nor compel a session to authorize the use of church property for a marriage service that the teaching elder or the session believes is contrary to the teaching elder's or the session's discernment of the Holy Spirit and their understanding of the Word of God." [last paragraph of the new wording of W-4.9000]

This language underscores our shared value of mutual respect when we, as faithful followers of Jesus Christ, disagree. But we need more than a constitutional provision of mutual forbearance; we need a graciousness of compassion and humility of spirit. We need to remind ourselves that, in the end, we are judged not so much by our rightness or wrongness, but by our compassion and our ability to set aside our own opinions and hear, really hear, what Christ is saying through each other.

As your leadership, we promise to listen. Your congregation may also have questions as the media reports come in. Some will be happy and others angry. We will hold you in prayer and be here for you. We are available to come and talk with congregations, sessions, pastors and share resources as they are made available.

Please join us in prayer for the life of our Presbytery and of our denomination in this time of great change. Now more than ever we need each other.
