From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

By the time you read this, it will surely be summer. Of course, it has felt like summer for some weeks now, but now the summer solstice has passed and we are meteorologically, astrologically and chronologically in the summer.

What will you do this summer? Will this be a time of relaxation? Will you be away from home? Will you be working less and trying to stay cool or maybe you will be on the golf course or on the beach?

Summer seems to be a time that many of us slow down. Rhythms change even in the churches. Here at Absecon, we have just one service on Sundays. The Sunday school is on hiatus until the fall. The Session also takes a vacation during the summer. But, we are still here. God’s house is still open. The worship of the Holy Trinity continues to occur each week, because our God takes no vacation. The Lord is still the sovereign of the universe and people are still redeemed every day.

Even when you are away, please remember to join in prayer each day. We still have much to do to bring God’s healing to a hurting world and prayer is the vehicle by which we begin and end our efforts as the Lord’s servant people. And, that brings up a question that we will consider into the fall. What does it mean to be a servant people?

We have many rights in our nation and many rights and privileges as God’s people. But, at the foundation is our servanthood. Jesus referred to the kind of servants we are called to be in Matthew 25 when He said that when we feed the hungry, clothe the naked, bring Good News to the poor and visit the imprisoned, we do it for God. When we work to bind up the wounds of the world, we are being servant people.

How we will continue to do that here in Atlantic County will be the subject of much of what we will do going forward. Now, take a deep breath, slow down and enjoy the blessings of nature and refresh yourselves at the ultimate oasis, which is the Word of God. The Lord is still active in the world and we are still here in Absecon to work together to seek how we can respond to that inestimable gift.

In the fall of 1981, Greg left the music scene and entered college, thinking he would be able to put his life back together. During this time a friend invited Greg to a Christian concert. That night was to be the new beginning he was desperately searching for, and the rest of his story is a shining example of the Grace of God.
