The Prayer Shawl Ministry is for all ages, for young and old – put your tea or coffee in a travel mug and bring it along to the Prayer Shawl group that meets on the first Saturday of each month at 9:30 in the Chapel. (Yes, this Saturday is the second one of October because we moved the date due to the predicted storm.) Please let Loretta Metz know if you will be joining us.

You do not need to know how to knit or crochet, can you tie knots? Then you can make a fleece throw. It is fun, easy and allows time to catch up on what others are doing, reminisce about growing up in the Atlantic City / Absecon area, and make a prayer shawl.

To date the group has given over 650 “prayer shawls” and, thanks to Nancy Conover, has a Yo-Yo quilt she made. The quilt was framed and will be hung in our atrium. Each Yo-Yo represents someone who has received one of our shawls. These shawls are dedicated during one of our Sunday services and then our group joins in prayer when a shawl is given.

We have lots of yarn for you to use to create a shawl. Or if you want to make a fleece shawl, please come to our next gathering and one of us will be happy to explain how to make one and what materials you will need.

This is a prayer you may want to say as you sit at home and work on your shawl:

Bless me, Lord. As I knit/crochet this prayer shawl, may you guide my hand to weave in warmth; may you guide my heart to weave in love; may you guide my mind to weave in comfort; may you guide my spirit to weave in hope. For in you we place all our faith.

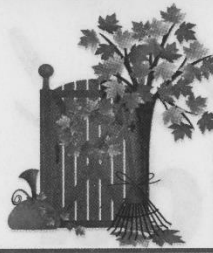

Stay Healthy this Fall: Get Vaccinated

Flu season typically starts in October and ends in May. AND unfortunately, COVID-19 is still with us. Get vaccinated to protect yourself and those around you from both viruses. Symptoms of flu and COVID-19 are similar, and infection can occur at the same time. Vaccines reduce the risk of severe illness and may prevent hospitalization and death. It is recommended everyone 6 months of age and older receive an annual flu shot and stay up to date on COVID-19 vaccines. Both shots can be given at the same visit.

In addition to getting vaccinated:

- wash your hands frequently
- avoid touching your face
- cover your coughs and sneezes,
- avoid crowds and poorly ventilated spaces
- clean commonly touched surfaces
- wear a mask when recommended
- and stay home if you're sick
