### Sometimes Plans Need to Change ! by Lisa Whitaker

Many of you who know me, how I love to plan ahead. So much that just yesterday, I received a 3 year planner in the mail (I still really like to have the paper planners – it's a pocket one that I carry with me all the time). I'm ready to make a concrete plan all the way to 2025 (I did resist getting the 5 year planner, it is a bit thick to carry around all the time)

My plans for June originally were to go to England, where I will be continuing to staff the Master's Degree Program I have been working with for the past 2 years. The in-person intensive for Module #5 will take place at one of our Mission's locations outside of London. Following that, a large conference in Norway is planned and I was intending on going there and then flying home.

In the wake of all that is happening in Ukraine, Poland and Romania, my heart has been stirred to go and do whatever is needed to help. The longer the war continues, the help seems to slow down and aid becomes less and less. I have heard the term, "compassion-weary", which is quite sad and yet also realistic. A small team of co-workers has come together to go. We decided NOT to go to the conference and planned on going to Poland for 10 days with an additional purpose of accessing the situation and seeing how our Discipleship Training Schools can serve in the future as well.

As we have communicated with the on ground staff there, we have had open hands as to what to do and how to use our time. Even as I write this it seems things are quite fluid as we hear of all the needs and make decisions as to how best to use our time.

One of the requests is that we help with a Family Camp that is taking place. Normally it is held for Polish families, but this year they are opening it up to Ukrainian refugees. We were told that they have even received applications from a group of teenagers from a Ukrainian orphanage.

As we have considered our time there, we really felt we need to say YES to helping with the set up of the camp and the initial days. Our return tickets were for the middle of the week of camp.

As I have prayed, I felt the Lord nudge me to try and change my ticket to stay for the whole week of camp. I'm still in the process of seeing if this works, but I have been reminded of the need for me to be open-handed and hold plans loosely. I can so often make a plan and no matter what want to stick with it, but sometimes circumstances, invitations, world-wide events and more change the best laid plans.

I am reading through the Psalms and again and again, the psalmists talk about following God's path : "I'm staying on your trail, I'm putting one foot in front of the other . . ." (Ps. 17:5 MSG), "He guides us in the paths of righteousness" (Psalm 23:3), "teach Your paths, O Lord" (Ps. 25:4), "Commit your way to the Lord" (Psalm 37:5) and the list goes on and on.

I appreciate your prayers as I leave for England the end of May and then head to Poland on June 20th. Right now, barring any other changes, I plan on returning on or around July 3rd, after the camp is completed.

Please pray that our team would be sensitive and responsive to both the refugees and the long term workers in Poland. Pray we would be a blessing and carry hope and life to this hurting part of the world. And as always, THANK YOU for your prayers and financial support. We are all on this team together!
