

SESSION SPOTLIGHT OCTOBER 3, 2023

And next week, construction will begin on the new kitchen so hot lunches may be prepared and served during the week to the hungry.
- 2. Cape May Zoo everyone had a great afternoon at the Zoo. We had a pavilion where hoagies, chips and beverages were enjoyed and then all had was time to visit the animals, take photos and just enjoy being together on a beautiful Sunday afternoon.
- 3. **New Bible studies** are beginning: Wednesday morning is led by Rita Abelson and the group is currently studying Jacob and Joseph Wednesday evening is led by Tina Harvey and the group is studying the last season of "The Chosen" November 8, both Morning and Evening Bible Studies will begin a four □ week Advent study from the book on the Grinch and "The Heart That Grew Three Times"
- 4. Please remember the Deacons when making **homemade breads or soups**. These two items are delivered to and enjoyed by our shut-ins.
- 5. To date we have delivered **251 pounds of fresh produce to the Food Bank** from our Church Garden. This year we grew zucchini; butternut and spaghetti squash; cucumbers; eggplant; green, yellow, and jalapeno peppers; lima and green beans; and tomatoes. There will be more harvested so stay tuned for an update.

National Wreaths Across America Day is a day to remember our fallen U.S. veterans by placing wreaths on their graves, and saying the names of the fallen, so as to not forget their sacrifices. Wreaths are laid as family and friends remember both those who made the ultimate sacrifice, and those who currently serve in the armed forces.

The Annual Holiday Tradition of honoring America's lost veterans will take place not only at Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, Virginia, but at over 3,700 locations across the U.S. and worldwide in 2023. This important day is an annual event that takes place every year on the third Saturday in December. This tradition helps family members, friends, neighbors, and volunteers all across the country lay wreaths at the gravestones of those who have served our country.
