Resurrection in the Air

Several years ago I was doing a staff workshop on the island of Cyprus. As is often my habit when I go to a new place, I do some investigating as to what places or events of historical importance are in the area. I love history, so in my free time I often scout out any local history spots. To my surprise one of the listings was a church that was the final resting place of Lazarus. It caught me by surprise. Wait a minute Lazarus was raised from the dead. Oh, yeah, but he DID die again at some point. So, I decided to go visit Lazarus' tomb, the one that he DIDN'T walk out of wrapped in burial cloths! As I sat there in the place of his burial, I pondered many things. What was it like for him to die twice? What did his friends or Mary or Martha think, if they were still around?

I then began pondering his story as recorded in John 11 and 12. In John 12:9, scripture states that because Lazarus' life was a testimony to the power Jesus had over death, the Pharisees plotted to kill him. Imagine that for a moment. Lazarus dies, is miraculously raised from the dead and then he gets word that the very leaders of his faith are plotting to KILL him because his life is a testimony to the power of God! This is why Lazarus made his way over to the island of Cyprus. History records that he fled to Cyprus and there led a large group of Jesus followers!

Lazarus' resurrection was some time before Passover, at least a week and possibly longer. In John 12, it is recorded that Jesus returned to Lazarus' home right before Passover and it was then that the Pharisees were plotting to kill both Lazarus AND Jesus. I find it interesting that Jesus' resurrection came on the heels, so to speak of Lazarus' resurrection. Imagine being one of the disciples or Mary or Martha and witnessing not ONE resurrection, but TWO all within a short time period. Death, resurrection, death, resurrection. What a roller coaster of emotions they all had to be on. Yet, what an amazing time, resurrection was in the air. Life after death

was before them. In those three years of hanging out with Jesus, his followers had witnessed resurrection several times. Did Jesus raise those others to life so that HIS resurrection would be a bit easier to accept, almost part of the norm? Did that theme of resurrection throughout his ministry provide a basis for a deep core belief in the hearts of the disciples that He IS the resurrection and the life? I don't know. What I do see and read and am pondering is that resurrection was in the air, it was the buzz word/event of Jesus' last days on earth.

What amazing hope He left for His friends to cling to, what thoughtful security that death is not something to be feared, but it is conquered. Do not lose hope, "Death, where is your sting?" (I Corinthians 15:55) As we celebrate Easter, let's remember . . .
