Stories from Romania from Lisa Whitaker

I never tire of hearing people's stories. When someone shares their story; where they came from, the path they took to get to where they are today, their family situation, I am always amazed. Amazed at the hardships and difficulties people have endured. Amazed at the perseverance and tenacity they have shown. But most of all, amazed at how God has led, provided, challenged and walked with them through very trying and discouraging circumstances. I've only been in Romania for a week and I have heard some absolutely unbelievable stories. I can't share all of the details here, but will share some of the overall points.

One Romanian woman shared her story of being abandoned by her 12 year old mother because she was only 3 lbs at birth. The doctor told her mother she could not take her home or she would die, when her mom came back to get her, she was still too weak and her mother was convinced by her family to abandon "the baby". Thankfully, "the baby" survived, but only to be put into an orphanage where she was abused. After 27 years of hating her parents, God spoke to her when she attended a Discipleship Training School. She was encouraged to forgive her parents, which she did and eventually set out to find them. When she met her mother, the first thing her mother told her was - "I came back for you, I wanted you, but I was 12 years old and was told to let you go."

One man from Ghana was sharing with us how when he was 11 years old, his father tried to convince his mother to move the family to a village. The mother was a Christian and knew that that particular village was led by witchdoctors. She knew that if she took her 5 small children there, they would be influenced and absorbed into witchcraft. His mother made the tough decision to stay where she was, even though her husband left and rarely sent any support. This man shared what a difficult childhood he had financially and yet he and his siblings have all followed a life-giving path because his Mom made the right decision even though it was the hard decision. His siblings are lawyers, a Customs officer and he is a missionary.

Another story I heard was from closer to home. One of the staff here in Romania is a 75 year old woman from Florida. This year (I'll repeat that) THIS year when she was 75, she sold her home and car, packed all her things into a few bins and went to Texas to do a Discipleship Training School. Her daughter, whose children are all out of the house, went with her. They attended the school and went on outreach together to Indonesia. Her daughter loved Indonesia so she stayed. This woman had on her heart to come to Romania, so she did. She has made a 2 year commitment to the Romanian base. I was so impressed with her "all out", "drop everything and go" attitude. She doesn't know the language; she is living in a small bedroom on the base and she is loving life. She is full of energy and so excited to be doing what God has called her to do. She said to me, "when people say they are living through me vicariously, I say, STOP, don't live through me, live the life God has called you to, whether that is where you are or overseas, but live YOUR life!" So, in just one week, these are a few of the stories I have heard. Whether you are from Romania, from Ghana, or from the US, God's hand is on you. Each of these friends had to make tough decisions, but they did and they are so full of life, it is beautiful.

May we all be willing to make the tough decisions - and when we do, hold on, cause God may take you places you never imagined.

Blessings to you all - I'm in the beginning of a 2 month trip so I will share more next month. Thank you for your prayers, please pray for health as I travel, I've already encountered a stomach bug!
